



Alfred Phillips Jr. aka San Akhnaton Yao Assegai A-SK

Someone has said that African-Americans do not know their true name. I agree. I chose my name *San Akhnaton Yao Assegai A-SK*. It is read in the pentagonal diagram clockwise starting with *San* near the one o'clock position.

As *San* people of Southern Africa are likely the oldest humans, I chose their name as my first.

*Akhnaton*, a pharaoh of Kemet (Egypt) and the true creator of monotheism, is said by Freud to have a “premonition of scientific knowledge ...” I chose his name as my second, as he may be regarded as the stimulator of the search for unity in nature/science.

Since I was born on a Thursday and have West African heritage, I chose *Yao* as my third name. Some West African name their Thursday born male children accordingly.

A weapon that Zulu used to defeat the invading British armies was the assegai. I use the name *Assegai* in the sense that my work attempts to destroy ignorance in people, especially World Africans.
